WORSHIP MINISTRY

Worship Committee: Plans and co-ordinates worship as an advisory group to the Rector.

Wayfarer's Chapel:

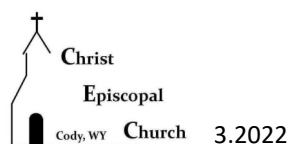
Located up the North Fork Highway, near Yellowstone National Park's East Entrance. 10 AM services in the summer are lead by Worship Leaders. Weddings are also often held at Wayfarer's Chapel .

Long Term Care Services:

Communion services are held the 1st Tuesday of each month at 10 AM in the Long Term Care Center commons and the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of each month at 4:00 PM at Absaroka Senior Living.

Little Explorers Preschool:

An independently operated cooperative preschool, providing a play-based, child centered learning environment, and is supported by the mission and outreach of Christ Church.



PARISH LIFE & EDUCATION

Godly Play:

Children through 5/6th grade meet on Sundays at 10:00 AM for Godly Play - Sept through May.

Journey to Adulthood:

Grades 6/7 - 7/8 meet for Rite 13 and Grades 8/9 - 9/10 meet for J2A on Sundays Sept through May and at other periodic times for various outing opportunities. Grades 10/11 -11/12 meet for YAC (Young Adults in the Church) Sept through May.

Adult Education Class:

Meets Sundays at 9 AM Sept through May. Watch the newsletter for specific offerings.

Formation Committee:

Plans and oversees the Sunday Adult Education Class and other various formation events.

Education for Ministry (EfM):

Advanced education program for adults. 4 year format coordinated by Sewanee School of Theology in Tennessee. Meets Mondays at 5:30 PM Sept through May.

Thomas the Apostle Center:

Educational Trust Committee:

The Educational Trust Committee sponsors semiannual public programs that are selected to challenge people's thinking on relevant, possibly controversial issues.

Fellowship Ministry:

Oversees congregational activities and organizes and sponsors special events during the winter and organizes Church Refreshment Hours.

Fellowship Store:

Proceeds support church & outreach programs.
